Modules: EAP. Business Studies, Global Studies, Maths for Business

Who is it for?

We recommend the IFY with Maths if:

- You would like to study on a business-related programme
- You would like to keep options open to scientific subjects, like computer science or engineering
- You are confident in mathematics

International Foundation Year in Business & Social Sciences (without Maths)

Modules: EAP, Business Studies, Global Studies, **Economics**

We recommend the IFY without Maths if:

- You would like to progress to a degree such as Law, Journalism, Literature or Politics after the Foundation Year.
- You are highly literate and have a flair for writing essays.
- You are not as confident in mathematics.

STANDARD PROGRAMME

Duration: 9 months (37 weeks total made up of 30 weeks tuition and exam plus induction weeks and holidays)

Average tuition/wk: 20 hours plus workshops and tutorials. The course demands at least 20 hours of self-study per week

Entry requirements: IELTS 5.5 (no subskill below 5.0) & country specific high school score



ACCELERATED PROGRAMME

Price: €14,850

Start date: January 2025

Duration: 7 months (29 weeks total made up of 26 weeks tuition and exam plus holidays)

Average tuition/wk: 25 hours plus workshops and tutorials. The course demands at least 20 hours of self-study per week

Entry requirements: IELTS 6.0 (no subskill below 5.5) & country specific high school score



Course Structure

The International Foundation Year is comprised of four modules: English for Academic Purpose (EAP) plus three subject modules – Business Studies, Global Studies and a choice of either Maths for Business or Economics.



ENGLISH FOR ACADEMIC PURPOSES (EAP)

IFY Streams: All Streams

Hours per week: 8 (Standard Programmes), 10 (Accelerated Programme)

This module is closely integrated with your subject modules to help you build good practice in academic work.

Module aims:

- Achieve the English language and academic skills required by UK university programmes.
- Take responsibility for own learning.
- Introduce the planning and organisation skills to develop as independent, autonomous learners.

Key areas covered in the syllabus:

- Listening understanding, note taking, summarising
- Reading annotation of text, paraphrasing, summarising and commenting
- Writing pre-writing skills, subject specific essays, referencing
- Speaking presentations, group discussion, reformulating ideas, pronunciation

BUSINESS STUDIES

IFY Streams: All

Hours per week: 4 (Standard Programmes) or 5 (Accelerated Programme) This module provides a solid grounding in many aspects of business studies and helps students prepare for an undergraduate course related to business management.

Module aims:

- Develop the knowledge and understanding required for the successful study of Business Studies and related Social Science disciplines at undergraduate level.
- Gain an understanding of the three key functional areas of business (marketing, accounting & finance and human resource management) as well as the external environment in which UK businesses operate and the topical issues which affect them.

GLOBAL STUDIES

IFY Streams: IFY without Maths

Hours per week: 4 (Standard Programmes) or 5 (Accelerated Programme) To prepare students for the successful study of Global Studies and related social science disciplines at undergraduate level.

Module aims:

- To help students understand the world around them by encouraging them to engage with key global events and issues in the 21st century.
- To look at important issues and events from different perspectives and reflect on their global impact.

- Introducing Global Studies

MATHS FOR BUSINESS

IFY Streams: IFY with Maths Hours per week:4 (Standard Programmes) or 5 (Accelerated Programme)

The overall aim of this course is to equip students with the mathematical knowledge and skills necessary for entry to the first year of any UK/ Western undergraduate degree course.

Module aims:

- To develop abilities to think logically, to recognise incorrect reasoning and to express ideas clearly.
- To develop an enthusiasm for the subject and the skills required to apply the knowledge to both the further study and application of mathematics.
- To develop an understanding of how theory and application work together and skills in modelling and the interpretation of results.

Key areas covered in the syllabus:

- Trigonometry
- · Linear and quadratic equations
- Simple probability
- Binomial expansions, sequences and series
- Calculus
- Functions
- Vectors

ECONOMICS

IFY Streams: All

Hours per week: 4 (Standard Programmes) or 5 (Accelerated Programme)

An introduction to basic economic concepts and principles, mostly focused on UK experiences in preparation for university. The first semester will deal with "micro" economic issues and the second semester will deal with "macro" economic issues.

Module aims:

- To develop key knowledge and understanding of economic concepts and principles in a national and global economic environment.
- To encourage students to analyse, explain and evaluate the strengths and weaknesses of the market economy and the role of government within it.

Key areas covered in the syllabus:

- Supply and demand
- The functions of price and price determination
- Inter relationship between markets
- Production in the long and short run
- Monopolies and oligopolies
- Macroeconomics
- Inflation
- Fiscal policy



NCUK works with its university partners to develop their academic content. The organisation also works with its university partners to set clear and transparent entry requirements for its students, to ensure they have the best chance of preparing for and succeeding at university.


This approach delivers results. 2021/22 data shows:

- 81% of IFY Programme international students passed the qualification, with 35% achieving AAA.
- 87% of International Year One Programme international students passed, with 16% achieving an overall distinction.

NCUK pathways set international students up for future success at university. 2020/21 graduate data shows:

- 70% of IFY international students achieved a 2:1 or higher.
- **89%** of International Year One international students achieved a **2:1 or higher.**
- **78%** of NCUK IY1 students also completed the NCUK IFY

Check whether you will need a Visa to study in Malta

We strongly recommend that you check the Visa and e-Residence permit requirements and procedures that you will need to follow in order to arrive and stay in Malta.

D Visa (long stay)

Allows you to stay in Malta for up to 365 days.

The main reasons for which an authorisation to stay in Malta for more than 90 days may be given include employment, studies, and family reunification.

If you do need to apply for a visa we strongly recommend that you do so at the earliest possible opportunity, particularly during the summer months as applications may take longer to be processed.

Non-EU/EEA nationals must have international health insurance to cover your period of stay in Malta. UE/EEA nationals are entitled to free treatment upon presentation of a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC).
